**Under this agreement for 2019
Kirwan State High School will receive**

\$947,842*

This funding will be used to

- Maintain 100% Year 12 students achieving a QCE/QCIA.
- Increase the percentage of Year 9 students achieving a C or better in both English and Mathematics to 85%.
- Increase the percentage of students attaining an A or B in all subjects (non-VET) to > 40%
- Increase the percentage of students achieving an Excellent/Very Good for Effort to 35% and Behaviour to 47%

Our initiatives include

- Continue to improve attendance, effort and behaviour in all year levels.
- Continue to engage teachers in the Collaborative Team Cycle to determine appropriate differentiation strategies ensuring every student succeeds.
- Continue to build teachers' capacity to teach reading and writing in all subject areas.
- Enhance the school's numeracy program to extend students' capacity to problem solve.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employ an additional 7 FTE of teachers to: \$630,000
 - Increase Guidance allocation
 - Fund an extra Deputy Principal
 - Fund 2 x HOC positions
 - Fund 5 x Peer Coaches
- Continue to engage an external reading and writing coach \$25000
- Provide professional development for teaching staff \$20000
- Continue to employ one CEC \$70842
- Continue to employ additional Teacher Aides to support the school's reading, writing and numeracy programs \$140000
- Employ a Teacher Aide for the Girls Indigenous Academy and Tracks 2 Success Program \$22000
- Employ an Additional 0.6 FTE Youth Support Co-ordinator \$40000
