

## MSF20516 Certificate II in Furniture Making Pathways

### Qualification description

This qualification is intended for people interested in exposure to a furniture making or related working environment with a view to entering into employment in that area.

This qualification delivers broad-based underpinning skills and knowledge in a range of furniture making tasks which will enhance the graduates' entry-level employment prospects in a furniture manufacturing environment or related workplace.

This is a one-year course delivered in Years 11 and 12 on site at Kirwan State High School.
