

CUA20720 Certificate II in Visual Art

Qualification description

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who are developing the basic creative and technical skills that underpin visual arts and craft practice. It applies to work in different visual arts, craft and design environments. The job roles that relate to this qualification may include Ceramics Studio Trainee, Community Arts Workshop Assistant and Arts Practitioner. It also provides a pathway to other visual arts, craft and design job roles.

Duration and location

This is a two-year course delivered in Years 11 and 12 on site at Kirwan State High School.

Assessment

Assessment is competency based and completed in a simulated visual arts, craft and design environment.

Units of competency are clustered and assessed in this way to replicate what occurs in a visual arts, craft and design environment as closely as possible.

Assessment techniques include:

- observations
- folios of work
- projects

Work placement

Students are provided with the opportunity to engage with industry professionals on campus throughout the duration of the course.
