- written and practical tasks.

# Work placement

Students are provided with the opportunity to do structured workplace learning where they will work in a real sport coaching related environment.

#### **Pathways**

This qualification pathway to work in assistant coaching roles working or volunteering at community-based sports clubs and organisations in the Australian sport industry. Individuals with this qualification use a defined and limited range of basic coaching skills to engage participants.
